Benefits: \$90,000 for 2-year grad program, internships, professional development, pathway to USAID Foreign Service.

Strings Attached: Fellows are expected to enter USAID Foreign Service upon completion of their graduate program.

Scoville Peace Fellowship

Applicant level: Recent college & grad school graduates

What they're looking for: Excellent academic accomplishments, demonstrable interest in peace and security. U.S. citizens, non-citizens living in U.S. with proper work visas.

Benefits: Six to nine months in DC (salary, health insurance, travel), working with public interest organizations.

Public Policy & Intl Affairs Fellowship

Applicant level: Undergrad; must not attain Bachelor's degree prior to start of Junior Summer Institute

What they're looking for: Commitment to completing a Master's in public policy/intl affairs; interest in a public service career, including with intl organizations. U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents.

Benefits: Full tuition at a summer institute; stipend, housing, and meal plan; books; \$5,000 scholarship at a PPIA graduate program if admitted, and more.

Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship

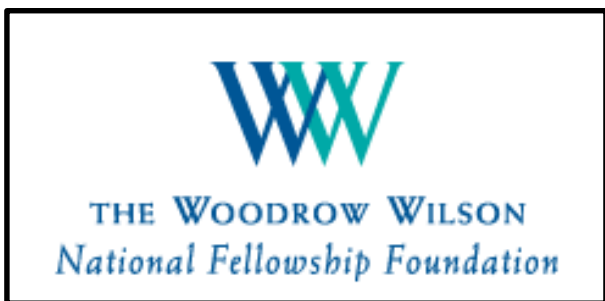
Applicant level: Juniors and graduate students
