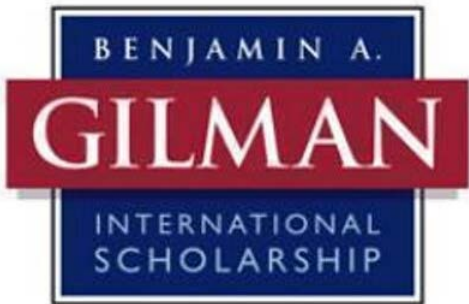


Selected scholarship opportunities for study abroad & language study:



Deadlines: October and March

Gilman Study Abroad Scholarship

Applicant level: Freshmen - Seniors

What they're looking for: Pell grant recipients with plans for a credit-bearing study or internship abroad at least four weeks in length. U.S. citizens only.

Benefits: Up to \$5,000 toward study abroad program; up to additional \$3,000 if studying a critical need language in the host country.

Critical Language Scholarship

Applicant level: Freshmen – grad students

What they're looking for: Students from a diverse range of disciplines who demonstrate need for a critical language in their academic and career goals. U.S. citizens only.

Benefits: Round trip travel, program fees, room/board, applicable visa fees, academic credit. Each language institute runs for roughly 2 months over the summer.

DAAD Undergraduate Scholarship

Applicant level: Sophomores and juniors

What they're looking for: Excellent students with well-defined research or study plans and interest in contemporary German and European affairs.

German language proficiency is helpful, but not mandatory. Open to both U.S. and non-U.S. citizens.

Benefits: Monthly stipend of 650 Euros for 4-10 months in Germany, plus funds for travel, research, and health insurance.

Amgen Scholars Japan Program

Applicant level: Sophomores, juniors, non-graduating seniors in science & engineering fields
What they're looking for: Strong academic record and interest in pursuing PhD; TOEFL=79 or IELTS=6.0. Open to both U.S. and non-U.S. citizens.
Benefits: Funded summer research at Kyoto University or University of Tokyo; mentoring & networking.
Other details: May apply to both institutions.

UK Fulbright Summer Institutes

Applicant level: Freshmen and sophomores
What they're looking for: Academically excellent students with leadership, extracurricular involvement, and a desire to act as ambassadors between the U.S. and UK. Applicants choose from 9 institutes 3-6 weeks in length and must demonstrate fit between their chosen program and their academic and career goals. U.S. citizens only.
Benefits: Round-trip airfare (U.S.-UK), tuition and fees, room and board.
